

# Tim lands top award

A WREXHAM fishmonger has been praised for the tip-top condition of his stall in the Butcher's Market.

Tim Wooldridge of "Tim's for Fish" has just had the seal of approval from the Food Standards Agency Wales.

Mr Wooldridge opened up a surprise envelope earlier this week and found a Bronze Welsh Food Hygiene Award.

The scheme aims to give recognition to food premises which have attained and maintained high standards of cleanliness and food hygiene practices.

For "Tim's For Fish" to have scooped the award, fishmongers' must have carried out

hazard analysis for the business and fulfilled the requirement of providing training food handlers under the Food Safety (General Food Hygiene) Regulations 1995.

The award is given at the discretion of the Council following an unannounced inspection.

Mr Wooldridge, whose business has been based in the Butcher's Market since 1990, said: "It was a surprise, I didn't even know that we were being considered."

"The first time I knew about it was when I opened the envelope and saw the certificate inside."
